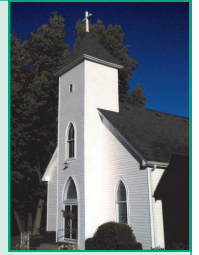

One more fact about homilies that is very interesting: they are optional! (sometimes) Sundays and Solemnities the priest is obligated to give a homily, however on any other day, the homily is optional. No homily can be jarring for some because most people are used to having a homily at every mass. There are times where it is appropriate or there is a fittingness to not having a homily, and that is at the discretion of the priest celebrating the mass.

Personally I don't usually pass on a homily in the parish, but when I do I think it is a nice time to reflect and remember that we are here for the mass, and it by itself is totally efficacious. Sometimes we put too much emphasis on the homily, and can even be tempted to think that mass did not go as well when the homily is not the best. This is not the case. We do not come to mass for the priest. We come to worship God! And so sometimes not having a homily can help us keep the right focus and remember who we are here to see; God!

And if I may share with you my one pet peeve; a priest preaches a HOMILY not a SERMON. The word homily comes from the Greek word *homilein* which means to have communion or hold verbal intercourse with a person. In the homily, the readings we just heard are understood more fully so we can be united through the Sacred Word of God. A sermon on the other hand is an oration about a practical matter, an admonition, or a moral subject in general. That is why protestants typically have sermons as they can preach on whatever they see fit each Sunday, while a priest is bound to preach on the readings given that weekend.
